Austin Microbiology is a substantive provider of services with >100,000 samples per year, including the Mercy Hospital for Women, Repatriation and Talbot hospitals.

Austin Pathology provides expert Pathologist oversight for Goulburn Valley Health Pathology. Austin Pathology has state of the art technology including laboratory automation, organism identification by mass spectrometry (MALDITOF), mycobacterial, mycological, molecular and serological services. The department has a well developed multi-drug resistant screening program for inpatients with links to the Doherty and MDU laboratories.
