Your doctor would like you to have a **Parathyroid Study**. This is a test looking for a parathyroid adenoma (type of benign tumour) or hyperparathyroidism (very active parathyroid gland).

Procedure: A cannula, a plastic line, is placed in your arm for injections. You are then given an injection of radiotracer that shows the thyroid. Pictures are taken 20 mins later. Whilst on the scanner the patient is given another injection to show parathyroid tissue. Scans are restarted 15 mins after this injection and take between 15-30 mins. The first part of the test takes approx. 60 mins to complete.

Additional scanning to performed 2 hours later and will take between 20-45 mins to complete. The entire procedure will take 2.5 – 3 hrs

Preparation: Nil.

An important note for women having Nuclear Medicine Scans:

As with any test using radiation, you must contact the Department of Nuclear Medicine before your appointment if:

- **You are or may be pregnant, or if you are breast-feeding**
- **Please do not bring small children with you**
