Research Profile

Project: Preparing people at high risk of falls for discharge home following rehabilitation: Do we meet the guidelines?

Investigators: Dr. Cathy Said, Dr. Jannette Blennerhassett, Dr. Frances Batchelor, Kathryn Shaw

Aims:

- Are people who are at risk of falling being correctly identified during rehabilitation?
- Are risk factors assessed/identified?
- Are strategies implemented to minimize fall risk?
- Is falls risk appropriately identified in discharge paperwork?

Progress: We have finished our medical record audit of 50 inpatients admitted to rehab to both the Repat and Talbot campuses. We only considered patients who were discharged home and were identified as at risk of falls in this audit.

We have prepared and submitted an abstract for the APA Conference later in the year.

Our ongoing plan is to conduct a more detailed data analysis and write up the project for publication.
