

INFORMATION FOR A OCTREOTIDE STUDY

Your doctor would like you to have a Octreotide Study

This is a study to evaluate the distribution of somatostatin receptors in the body.

PROCEDURE

- You are injected with a radioactive tracer and are required to return for scanning at 4 and 24 hrs following the injection.
- The scan will take between 45 90 mins to complete each time.
- You may require further imaging however this will be determined at that time.

Please Note: There may be a 30 min wait between your arrival time and injection, as it needs to be prepared on your arrival in the department.

PREPARATION:

- You will receive instructions the Doctor
- Please bring your request with you

An important note for women having Nuclear Medicine Scans:



As with any test using radiation, you must contact the Department of Molecular Imaging & Therapy before your appointment if:

- You are or may be pregnant, or if you are breast-feeding
- Please do not bring children under the age of 12 with you, due to potential for exposure to radiation.
