Ophthalmology Department

The Austin Health Ophthalmology unit is staffed by 15 Consultant Surgeons, a RANZCO accredited registrar, an unaccredited registrar and a HMO. We provide a broad range of ophthalmic services including:

- Cataract surgery
- Eyelid, eye socket and tear duct reconstruction
- Surgery for periocular and orbital tumours (tumours of the eye and the area around the eye)
- Surgery for corneal and anterior segment disorders
- Surgery for glaucoma
- Laser treatment of glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy and other retinopathies

Unaccredited Ophthalmology Registrar

The purpose of this 12-month position is to be the key full time medical officer involved in the provision of ophthalmic care at Austin Health.

With the support of consultants, the registrar is responsible for emergent, ambulatory and inpatient ophthalmic diagnosis and management. This will include performing ophthalmic procedures such as ophthalmic laser and intravitreal injections under appropriate supervision.

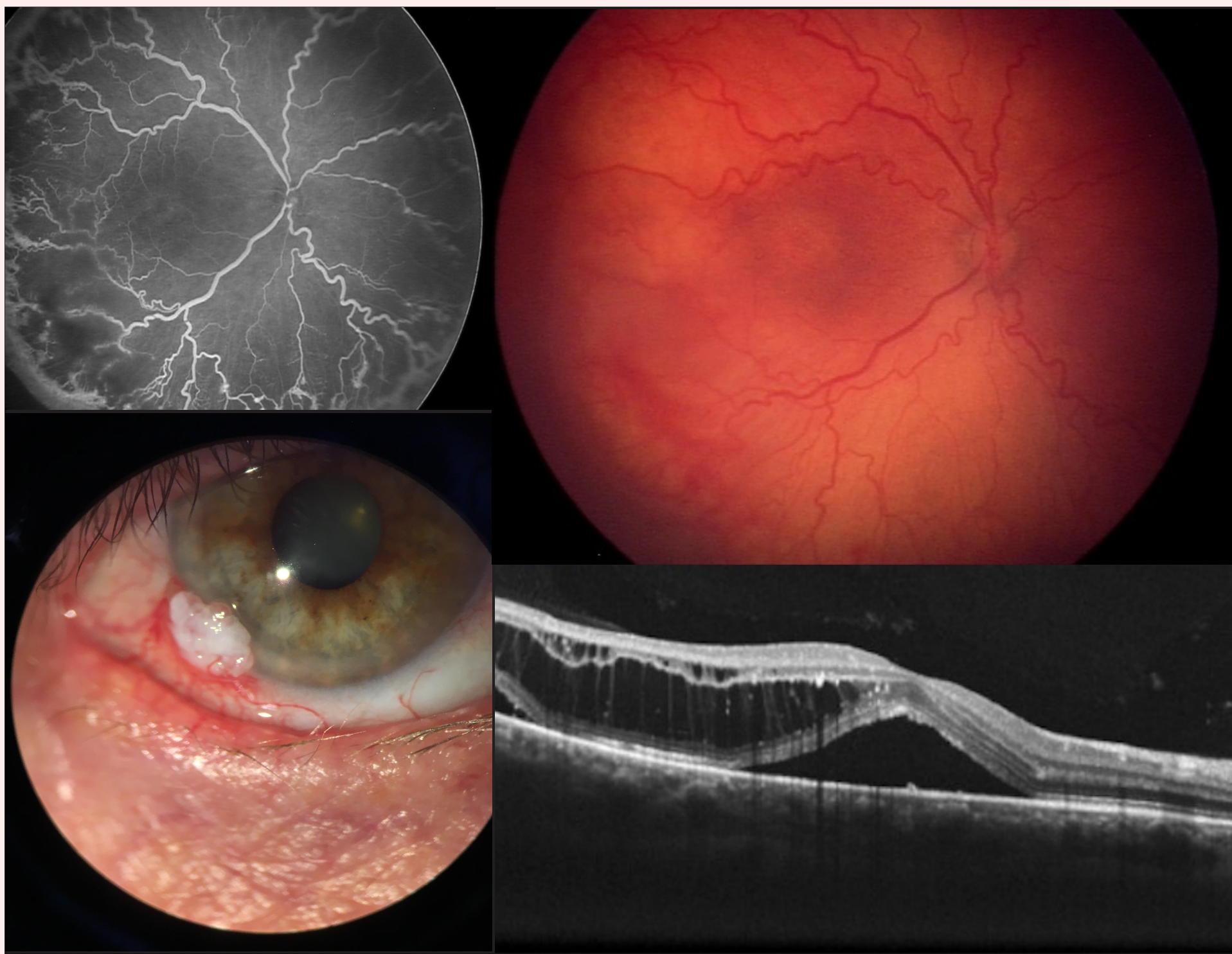
We strongly support the development of ophthalmology registrars in their journey to becoming independent clinicians. The ophthalmology registrar is expected to take the opportunity to learn from the varied educational and clinical opportunities available at The Austin Hospital.

Duties will include:

- Three ophthalmology clinics per week
- Assisting at four operating lists per week
- One in two on call
- Medical student teaching
- Opportunities for clinical research, presentation and audit
