

Transition to Specialty Practice: Intensive Care Unit



ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Transition to Specialty Practice Program: Intensive Care Unit is designed to introduce nurses to the critical care environment. Nurses will attend study days in conjunction with experiential learning to equip them with the knowledge and skills required for quality intensive care nursing practice. Concepts explored will include advanced patient assessment skills, haemodynamic monitoring and care of the patient requiring mechanical ventilation.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Participants will develop and demonstrate the capacity to problem solve and think critically in the intensive care clinical environment
- Participants will demonstrate an alignment of clinical and theoretical knowledge while planning and implementing the care of the patient requiring intensive care

- Registered Nurses with minimum of 12 months acute clinical experience
- Registration with Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA)
- Applications from 2022 Graduate Nurse Program participants are welcomed
